



From Jared Cave:

Maggie's New Vision

“What do you want to do with your life?” was a question that would produce frustration for Maggie. If you are a college student you cannot avoid this question on a regular basis, and **many students, like Maggie, struggle to have a clear VISION for their future.** Maggie went to Jubilee this year hoping that God might help to answer this question for her.

Maggie was afraid to give any answer, because she did not want to commit to anything. She says “It’s as if once I say I might want to pursue a career in ministry, I will be locked into that career for life.” At Jubilee she went to a session where a CCO staff shared what it’s like to be a full time campus minister with the CCO. **It was in that session at Jubilee where Maggie began to have peace in following God’s call.**

Maggie will spend this summer at the “Ocean City Beach Project” (OCBP) run by the CCO. OCBP is a summer where students live in community with other Christ followers, while they receive teaching and discipleship from CCO staff and various guest speakers. Many CCO staff took their first step toward full time ministry at OCBP. **Wherever Maggie ends up she is beginning to trust in God’s VISION for her future.**

Thanks for supporting this ministry to CCAC students. Your generous giving is playing a role in helping Maggie follow Christ with her whole life.

Dear friends,

Thank you once again for your support of my trip to Puerto Rico. It was a whirlwind couple of weeks right before the trip when we learned we could not travel to Haiti but would reroute our team to Puerto Rico. While it turned out to be a trip very different from the one we were originally planning, it was an amazing opportunity to be able to serve in the small community of Villa Esperanza, Puerto Rico. The people we met are still struggling to rebuild their homes and many parts of their lives in the aftermath of Hurricane Maria which struck the island close to a year and a half ago. Many are trapped in poverty, broken systems, and feel as though they have been forgotten about. Puerto Rico may not have been our original destination, but it was where we certainly were called to serve on this trip. We saw God do powerful things through our team and bring love and hope to people in much need.

I deeply appreciate all of your giving, encouragement, and prayers. Please continue to pray both for the people of Puerto Rico and for Haiti. It can be discouraging to see the suffering and pain that people are walking through in these parts of the world, but I am

always reminded through these trips about the power of hope and the Gospel - that sometimes it is the smallest actions, like building someone a front porch, that can have incredible impact.

In a couple of weeks, I will be headed out to Springfield, Missouri to attend Convoy of Hope's Field Team Leaders summit. This is the next step in my journey of being able to lead additional teams, throughout the year, with Convoy of Hope. I am looking forward to both the training and community parts of this experience. And while trips to Haiti continue to be on hold for the time being, I am expecting that I will have the opportunity to return to Puerto Rico with additional teams of college students over the summer and fall months.

The Heidelberg Catechism

Continuing after the fall of man...



12. Q. Since, according to God's righteous judgment we deserve temporal and eternal punishment, how can we escape this punishment and be again received into favour?

A. God demands that his justice be satisfied. Therefore we must make full payment, either by ourselves or through another.

13. Q. Can we by ourselves make this payment?

A. Certainly not. On the contrary, we daily increase our debt.

14. Q. Can any mere creature pay for us?

A. No. In the first place, God will not punish another creature for the sin which man has committed. Furthermore, no mere creature can sustain the burden of God's eternal wrath against sin and deliver others from.

Q. What kind of mediator and deliverer must we seek?

A. One who is a true and righteous man, and yet more powerful than all creatures; that is, one who is at the same time true God.
