

Though my parents never intended it, their spiritual nurturing included exposing me to the ministry of the poor to the rich. They built our family home on a three-acre plot next door to a one-room shack without water, electricity, indoor plumbing, or a furnace. Albert Jupp lived with his aged and ill mother in that smelly, dank shack. As he was occupied with the care of his mother, Albert was unable to hold down a steady job. Somehow they eked out an existence beside the Stevens, their rich next-door neighbors. Today the rich hardly see the poor except on television or from an air-conditioned tour bus.

Each night Albert would get a pail of water at our outside tap, which was always kept running, even in the dead of winter when our neighbors had their taps safely protected from freezing. My mother was one of the most generous souls on earth, and her sensitive conscience would not allow her to set a fine meal before our family without thinking of Albert and his mother. So night after night I was asked to make a pilgrimage up the hill to the shack with two portions from our table for our poor neighbors. I confess that as a teenager I usually resented doing this. But when I think was bothering me was how that nightly visit to the Jupps made me think about my own existence as a rich young man. Daily I was confronted existentially with the truth that the rich cannot know God well without relating to the poor.

Greetings Friends and Family - First, please accept our apologies for not keeping all of you up to date (especially those who receive news via Dear Friends letters). While we spent time with many of you during the summer months and have shared with you how God is at work in Cambodia through our Christmas letter and annual report, we also realize that it has been some time since our last, complete update. I'm sorry to say that our next update will be delayed as well given our current circumstances. Read on ...

Family News - like many of you, our family is facing challenging times. Deb came to the U.S. near the beginning of March due to an illness in her family. As of the writing of this message on March 26, Mark and Zach are in Holland, MI, in self-isolation, Deb is in Dearborn, MI, staying with her sister, both Zach's school (NWC) and the Phnom Penh Bible School have closed their campuses, and, the Cambodian government has banned entry into the country of all foreigners for at least the next month. We cannot return home. And, just yesterday, Deb's Dad, Ralph Schneider went to be with the Lord. Thank you for sharing your love, prayers, and support! There is Good News! First, while we mourn Ralph's death, we are a people of a true and certain hope that he is in the presence of the Lord and so we rejoice! The Lord has wiped away every tear from his eyes—no mourning, crying, or pain. For Ralph, all things are now new again. Not even the bullet wound he sustained in WWII, which gave him such pain during his life, will keep him from standing before God's

throne to join in the great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages to worship the Lord! Likewise, we are thankful that in God's perfect timing Deb was able to arrive in the U.S. before her father became unable to communicate. We're thankful that the Bible school closed when it did and Mark was able to get a flight out before the country "closed" and that there was housing available through the RCA for Mark after he arrived for him to safely self-isolate in. We're thankful that Deb and her sister were able to visit with their dad one last time after being banned from the retirement complex (like every other facility due to Corona concerns). We're thankful that Zach was able to safely drive from IA to MI on his own and that the RCA Global Mission staff and so many of you have shown us your love through words of encouragement and comfort and your actions. People have brought food and supplies, gone to the pharmacy, and even shared their toilet paper! For these gifts and many more, we give thanks to the Lord!

We are also thankful that the car accident that we were in after the Christmas holiday (a chain-reaction crash with five vehicles) did not badly injure anyone, including us! And, that our insurance company came through as promised. The car is, in many ways, better than before the accident. Please join us as we pray for: • God's comfort for those who have and are suffering in this current global crisis. • God's wisdom and strength for the leaders of the world, that they would find the best way forward. • God's strength and protection for essential workers who are on the front lines every day. They go out so we do not need to. Especially healthcare workers, truck drivers, those working in funeral homes and nursing homes and members of various branches of public services, and so many more! • God's work in and through our pastors, elders, mission leaders, and chaplains who are working overtime to guide and spiritually nourish so many in these challenging circumstances (and figuring out how to best do so each day). • God's grace and peace for our family and other missionaries who are either still in their places of mission or others, like ourselves (and some international students), who are now unable to return home.
