Anna Gordon, a daughter of PRC who is now serving as a hospital chaplain in the Midwest, sent this update for the church family. If you missed church on 8/22 her message is reprinted here:

Philippians 4:4-7--

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. **5** Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. **6** Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. **7** And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Today is Thursday, August 12, 2021(or at least it was when I wrote this!). This morning mom asked me to write a short update for her to share with the church congregation about the last year... So much has happened since I saw everyone more than 2 years ago. While

there have been many events to rejoice over since I left NJ in Aug. 2019 there has also been fear, sadness, anger, and almost every emotion I know.

Today I came into work, and for the first time in almost 6 months I started my day by putting on green scrubs. Our COVID special precautions unit reopened on Monday, August 9th. Today is my first day working a shift as the dedicated covid chaplain. Wearing Scrubs, a PAPR, carrying a different pager, and responding to all the patient and staff needs on the unit.

Like I hear so often in the hospital over the last 18 months, "this is not what I signed up for..." Over the last year I have experienced ongoing change and uncertainty in my job as a hospital chaplain.

Philippians 4 is taped to the wall of my office. Sometimes when I see it, the words give me hope and encouragement, other days I read it and laugh, somedays I read it and cry. Over the last year my emotions seem to be all over the place, but in a way I would be worried if that wasn't true. Learning to be a hospital chaplain while also learning to navigate a global pandemic hasn't been easy.

The words of Paul sometimes feel comforting, other days they feel like an unattainable goal: "Rejoice in the Lord always... Do not worry about anything... the peace of God... will guard your hearts."

Officially, I am the staff chaplain for Inpatient Behavorial Health, Outpatient Addiction Treatment, Labor and Delivery, Pediatrics, NICU, PICU, and Medical Specialties (a dual diagnosis unit for people with physical and mental illness). I run spirituality groups, baptize babies, provide communion, and emotional and spiritual support to patients and staff. Unofficially, I go where I am needed, and serve anyone who requests assistance. While my favorite floors are where I am assigned, I am also often overseeing palliative care patients, organ donations, and traumas in the ER.

During the last year I have responded to more deaths than I care to remember. I have sat and prayed with patients who were alone and scared in the hospital. I have spoken on the phone to family members unable to come to the hospital because of visitor restrictions. Everyday I sit and hear the fears and worries of my community.

Despite that I wouldn't change my job. While covid has made the work more challenging I am doing what I love, providing support and encouragement to people who are feeling lost and alone. During all this I helped mentor three new chaplain residents, 1 who just accepted a job in Alaska, 1 who is a military chaplain, and 1 who has accepted a 2nd year residency in order to learn more about chaplaincy and working in behavioral health.

On Monday, (tomorrow) the new residency starts. I will meet 4 new students and begin the process all over again. I don't know what the next year will look like but I am excited to live out the words of Philippians 4 with our patients, staff, and fellow chaplains.

Upcoming Activities


