Call to Confession from Psalm 51

Friends, as we come to our time of corporate confession, we recognize that we are all in this together. We are all created in God's image and loved by him. We share the same brokenness and sin. So let's go to God, knowing that he doesn't meet us in judgment, but in love. Say these words with me:

Have mercy on us, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out our transgressions. ² Wash away all our iniquity and cleanse us from my sin. ³ For we know our transgressions, and our sin is always before us.

- ⁷ Cleanse me with hyssop, and I will be clean; wash me, and I will be whiter than snow.
- ⁸Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones you have crushed rejoice.
- ⁹ Hide your face from my sins and blot out all my iniquity.
- ¹⁰ Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me.
- ¹¹ Do not cast me from your presence or take your Holy Spirit from me.
- ¹² Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me. Lord, hear our prayer. Lord, have mercy.

Words of Assurance and Hope from Psalm 103

Friends, we are not defined by the things we have accomplished or things we have failed at, neither are we defined by our worst day or our worst action. The center of who we are is that we are loved and accepted. We have been redeemed and we are being restored. Hear these words from Psalm 103.

Praise the LORD, my soul; all my inmost being, praise his holy name.

² Praise the LORD, my soul, and forget not all his benefits—³ who forgives all your sins and heals all your diseases, ⁴ who redeems your life from the pit and crowns you with love and compassion, ⁵ who satisfies your desires with good things so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's.

For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his love for those who fear him; ¹² as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us. ¹³ As a father has compassion on his children, so the LORD has compassion on those who fear him; ¹⁴ for he knows how we are formed, he remembers that we are dust.

Scripture: Matthew 17:1-8

Sermon: Everything Will Change

17 After six days Jesus took with him Peter, James and John the brother of James, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. ² There he was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and his clothes became as white as the light. ³ Just then there appeared before them Moses and Elijah, talking with Jesus. ⁴ Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here. If you wish, I will put up three shelters—one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah." ⁵ While he was still speaking, a bright cloud covered them, and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased. Listen to him!" ⁶ When the disciples heard this, they fell facedown to the ground, terrified. ⁷ But Jesus came and touched them. "Get up," he said. "Don't be afraid." ⁸ When they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus.
